1. Mr. Ferrera, BHS teacher and SHEA Officer, read a statement from Mr. Foglia, SHEA President. SHEA is very concerned that the Board has not heard any of the recent grievances. Mrs. Coons responded that SHEA was in violation of the contract when it handed the grievances to the Board at the February 19, 2014 meeting. Mrs. Coons stated that she never should have accepted the package. She reminded SHEA to follow the grievance procedures in the contract.

2. Ms. Whittle, BHS teacher, began to explain an issue she is having with lesson plans. Mrs. Coons interrupted her at this point and stated that the Board cannot discuss or hear the merits of an ongoing grievance.

3. Mrs. DeStefano, Bedwell teacher, voiced her concerns about the number of students per class in the  $3^{rd}$  and  $4^{th}$  grades.

4. Heather Hunkele, BHS teacher, inquired about Professional Development for PARCC testing. Mrs. Shouffler responded.

5. Ms. LaBruno expressed her concerns about PARCC testing and APA students.

6. Mrs. O'Brien, BHS teacher and resident, was thrilled with the budget. She asked if there could be a committee comprised of board members and teachers to discuss issues further. Mrs. Coons stated that this is not recommended by either the NJ School Boards or the School Board Attorney. Mrs. Coons suggested that the place to discuss issues is at the Superintendent Professional Relations Committee.

7. Mr. Falzarano, BHS teacher and resident, was pleased with the budget. He would like the opportunity to showcase classroom projects to Board members.

8. Ms. Martin, BMS teacher, stated communication between the Board and staff are at an all-time low. She would also like to see a committee of Board members and teachers.

9. Mrs. Negri, paraprofessional and resident, asked why the district is using Source4Teachers. Mrs. Hunter responded that the contract is for substitute paraprofessionals.
