Report of the Superintendent

- Curriculum Presentation Bedwell Support Programs for Reading and Math Ms. Phelan, Bedwell Principal, introduced Lauren Smith, Janis Virtue and Gretchen Dempsey who presented the Bedwell Elementary School Support Program for reading and math.
- 2. Student/Staff

The Hobbit is being presented at the B.H.S. Pac Center on November 19, 20 & 21, 2010. The Digital Photography Show at Starbucks in Bernardsville begins Thursday evening, November 18th.

- 3. Mr. Miller introduced Mr. Baker who announced that the Borough of Bernardsville received bronze level Sustainable Jersey certification. Bernardsville completed an energy audit for the municipal buildings and a natural resource inventory, plus 14 other action items, to reach this level. Only 67 towns in NJ (or about 10%) are certified. Sustainable Jersey is a certification program for municipalities in New Jersey that want to go green, save money, and take steps to sustain their quality of life over the long term. Board of Education member and Co-Chair of the Borough Green Team, Robert Baker, accepted the award along with Mayor Lee Honecker.
- 4. Mr. Miller introduced Mrs. Hunter who announced that the district is eligible for the "Energy Star Leader Award" for 10% reduction in energy during the first 9 months of the SEE Program. In addition, B.M.S. is eligible for the "Energy Star Label Award" for superior energy management.

- 1. Mr. DiGioacchino asked the Board to give a lot of thought to Chief Valentines' concerns. The Board should not compromise the safety of our kids. Mr. DiGioacchino asked what was the rationale for dropping the appeal of Judge Ciccone's decision. No other district in the State is required to go to the Planning Board on these matters.
- 2. Mrs. Kellogg questioned why the school district would release a photo to be used for a politician's campaign. Mr. Miller responded that the photo in questions was taken by the Bernardsville News, not the school district.
- 3. Mr. DiGioacchino commented on discouraging politicians from using our students' pictures in political campaigns.
- 4. Mr. Lincoln said that the neighbors have demonstrated a willingness to compromise and have been volunteering their efforts to assist the school district in completing the project.

*Note: The areas of permitted voting for the Bedminster district representative of the Board of Education are: 1) tuition charged by the sending district and bill lists or contracts to be used for the sending district's pupils; 2) new capital construction to be used by the sending district's pupils; 3) appointment, transfer of removal of teaching staff serving the sending district's pupils, including central administration; 4) addition or deletion of curricular or extracurricular programs involving the sending district's pupils.

Mrs. Coons, President, shared the following with the public:

Mr. Miller has served at the Somerset Hills School District for 32 years. The positions Mr. Miller served as include, the Superintendent and Interim Superintendent for 7 years, Assistant Superintendent, Curriculum director, Director of guidance, Technology Teacher and Coordinator just to name a few. We attribute the fact that our referendum was completed on time and under budget to the profound leadership of Mr. Miller. You would be hard pressed to find any other NJ construction project that can tout that accomplishment.

Presently, there are many schools districts with interim superintendents in the state. As we embark on creating a budget, hiring a new high school principal, working on shared services and preparing for the upcoming contract negotiations with the Union, we have only one choice for leadership in the district and that is to return Pete Miller as superintendent. We need to hire a high school principal whom will need support and direction as they assimilate into our school culture and mission while administering the curriculum goals and strategic plan. With our superintendent this board has been very successful in reducing spending and lowering administrative costs while maintaining programming at little or no increase to the tax payer. With the possibility of additional cuts we need the experience of Mr. Miller and his team to be able to accomplish that as we begin to prepare for negotiations and try to maintain a strong staff and be fiscally responsible.

We know that negotiations will be arguably more challenging than in the past and we remain as a district with only one administrator that has any history. Who will it be that remains to administer this new contract after we all walk away from the negotiating table? There will be only one leader that has the experience, history, and relationships to work on rebuilding those bridges that affect the education of our students. Unlike any other organization, our greatest asset is children and we need to remember that it is our job to protect and educate them in a safe comfortable environment.

With that said, superintendent contract discussions began in August and the executive county superintendent approved all key elements in early September and followed up with a letter of confirmation that was received on November 1. Mr. Miller has volunteered to accept a three year pay freeze, with the elimination of disability and life insurance, and no tuition reimbursement. He will contribute 1.5% of his salary toward healthcare and accept a contract that includes a potential merit bonus. His total net loss is 14.2% of previous compensation. This is a model for all future employment contracts district wide. As compared to the proposed Governor Christie model of a capped superintendent salary the difference is \$31,000.00/year* and risking the quality of our education, which directly impacts the value of our homes.

At this juncture, we believe this is the most prudent and responsible thing that this board of education can do to protect the education of our students, support our staff and be fiscally responsible to the taxpayers. *I district compensation is: 157,500 + 15% bonus = 181,000.
