### **Report of the Superintendent**

- 1. Schools for Energy Efficiency (SEE) Update Mariel O'Brien reported on activities in the schools and on the cost savings of \$44,000 for the first half of the year under the Schools for Energy Efficiency.
- 2. Violence & Vandalism Prevention Awareness Week is October 18-22, 2010. Activities scheduled throughout the district.

Mr. Miller shared that at Bedwell students will learn to appreciate how we are alike and celebrate our differences. Teachers will engage students in activities to promote good character as a means to prevent bullying and lessons will be presented on tolerance.

At the Middle School Students will be viewing bullying videos and discussions will be taking place after with anti-bullying strategies. Students in 7<sup>th</sup> grade are doing research on the history of prejudice and violence and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students are discussing violence in schools. The 8<sup>th</sup> Grade will also attend the Youth Summit at BHS where they will be engaged in activities about difficult choices, relationships and respect.

At B.H.S. the focus of the activities will be on stress and anger. The activities will show how the inappropriate expression of anger and poor stress reduction are the root causes of violence. Activities will focus on facts and myths about anger, anger management and stress reduction techniques, and provide resources for help when anger is out of control or help for victims. T-shirts will be worn with a quote from the Dalai Lama – "We can never obtain peace in the outer world until we make peace with ourselves." Also there will be an anger management scavenger hunt, posters and signs and the morning announcements will all provide helpful information.

- 3. Violence & Vandalism Report 2009-2010 Mr. Miller reported Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:17-46, seven acts of violence and vandalism were reported to the NJ Department of Education Electronic Violence and Vandalism Reporting System (EVVRS) during the 2009-2010 school year. Five incidents of substance abuse, one incident of vandalism and one incident of weapon possession occurred in the high school.
- 4. Code of Student Conduct Report 2009-2010

Mr. Miller reported that there were 639 referrals for the 2009-2010 school year (465 at BHS, 62 at BMS, 112 at BES). The most referrals were for cell phone and IPod use (prohibited items), cutting class and misconduct. School responses to the violations are based on the severity and occurrences with warnings and points as the most frequent consequence or ISS and OSS detention for more severe infractions.

The Code of Student Conduct at each of the schools in the district has proven to be successful. At Bedwell Elementary school, the effectiveness may be witnessed in the large number of awards given to students through the Character Education Program. At the middle school, student behavior continues to be satisfactory and both the purposes and content of the Code of Student Content have proven to be highly effective. At the high school, only a small percentage of students violate the Code of Conduct and the vast majority of the infractions are minor. While the use of prohibited objects such as cell phones and i-Pods is a distraction, we are very lucky to say that it is our most prevalent problem. Furthermore, it is very rare for a student to have a second infraction of this nature; this is due to the consequence of one day of In-school Suspension Alternative Program (ISAP) for second offenses. Our schools remain very safe and the vast majority of students uphold the Code of Conduct on a consistent basis.

- Congratulations to girls cross country team member Dana Giordano who received the Star Ledger Athlete of the Week Top Performer for Week 2.
- Seniors Jonathan Robinson and Allison Hildebrandt were selected 2010 Homecoming King and Queen this past weekend.
- Brian King from Bernardsville Middle School received a \$3,161 grant from the PSE&G Environmental Education Grant Program to undertake an environmental research project with his 8th grade students. The students will learn how the residential community, local industry, and agriculture affect the Mine Brook Stream. The project will consist of field research, including data collection during field trips and assessment of samples in the classroom, to assess the community's impact on the stream. During field trips to the stream, Mr. King will guide students in the collection and analysis of data related to water quality.
- Mr. Miller spoke about retired BHS Social Studies teacher, Joe Poplowski who taught for 32 years, retiring in 2005. On Tuesday, he lost his battle with cancer. Joe was a very dedicated teacher who provided enthusiasm to his lessons and to his life. He touched many lives at B.H.S.
